**Township Named “Tree City USA” for 3<sup>rd</sup> Year; Wins Growth Award for 2<sup>nd</sup> Time**  
*Township Hosts Arbor Day Celebration on Friday, April 27, 2012*

**Twinsburg Township, Summit County, Ohio – April 27, 2012** – The Board of Twinsburg Township Trustees is pleased to announce that the Township has once again been named a Tree City USA. This honor recognizes continuing Township efforts to plant and maintain trees on Township properties. In 2010 the Township made history as only the second Township ever in the entire State of Ohio to receive this award. Township residents should take pride in the fact that they live in a community where planting and nurturing trees is a priority.

For the second year in a row, the Township has also been named recipient of a Tree City USA Growth Award. The Growth Award recognizes environmental improvement and encourages higher levels of tree care. This award is designed to recognize achievement, communicate new ideas, and help leaders improve community tree care. Tree City USA communities qualify for the Growth Award by completing activities to strengthen their local tree care programs.

In conjunction with receiving its “Tree City USA” designation, the Board of Trustees hosted an Arbor Day Celebration on Friday, April 27, 2012 @ 12:00 noon at Twinsburg Township Hall (1790 Enterprise Parkway). This event included the planting of a Brandywine Red Maple tree by Jason Knowles, the Township’s consulting forester. Attendees learned about the proper way to plant a tree and took a “tree tour” of Township Hall property, led by Jason Knowles.
